

Many of our goals focused on using level one or two voices in the classroom (whisper or quiet talking) or goals that focused on listening to directions the first time. We will also be setting goals in literacy (reading and writing) and math!

3-5 Classroom Updates

Third through fifth graders colored cards this week for WELS prison ministry. The people who receive these cards do not receive love from everyone they meet. Our class prays together that God uses his Word to grow faith in the hearts of people serving sentences. We also hope a kind greeting from us encourages them as they grow in faith.

6-8 Classroom Updates

This week in Social Studies the 7-8th graders have been studying how our nation's Constitution was constructed and what it all says. Each of the students selected a portion of the constitution, studied it, and presented a Slideshow using their Chromebooks about what they found within their section. In grades 6-8 we have enjoyed reading our first novel, <u>Tuck Everlasting</u>. In this novel some of the characters come across a water source that allows them to live forever. Despite this sounding like a good thing, these characters find out that living forever also has some surprising downsides. The discussion of living forever has led us into some deep conversations about our Christian faith and heaven. As Christians we have a place promised to us through faith in Jesus where we will live forever. God promises that this place will be without sin and will be nothing but joy and peace for eternity.
