# General School Updates

## **Standardized Testing (MAP Testing) April 29- May 3**

This next week of school our students in grades K-8 will be taking their final round of standardized tests or "MAP Tests". We continue to use the standardized testing system that we first started using last year. Each student in these grades will be taking Language, Math, and Reading tests this coming week as well as at two other points later on during this school year. These tests are all done online and results are available almost immediately. These tests allow us to monitor the academic growth of each student during the year and help our teachers adjust their instruction to meet the specific needs of all of our students. Parents are encouraged to make sure that their children are well rested and have a good breakfast each day this next week to help children focus and perform to the best of their ability on these tests. Please encourage your child to not feel any anxiety about the tests as the results don't have any bearing on their report cards or on any decisions about passing or failing or grade level. The main purpose of the tests is to help our teachers and school best serve each individual student with an effective education based on their specific needs!

## **All Day Track Meet Gr. 5-8 - May 6**

As part of our Physical Education program, all 5-8th graders will be traveling to the annual Lutheran Grade School track meet in Sleepy Eye on Monday, May 6th. Students should bring along a lunch, snacks, and plenty of water or sports drinks to stay hydrated throughout the day. Sunscreen and layered clothing will also be helpful depending on the weather that day. Track spikes may be worn, but are not necessary. That morning we will need to leave school right away at 8 A.M. The field events begin at 9 A.M. and the running events begin at 10 A.M. The meet typically lasts all day. Last year we got back to school around 2:45 P.M. but it will always depend on how many students are participating from each school and in each event and how efficiently the meet runs.
