

## K-2 Classroom Updates

The K-2 class celebrated the 100th day of school today! To celebrate, we counted to 100, brought 100 things from home to compare and share, read books about the 100th day of school, and thought what we would do if we had \$100.

This week also brought the start of our telling time unit in math. The first and second graders are learning to tell time to near hour and half hour. Next week, second grade will learn to tell time to the nearest minute. Kindergarten explored different kinds of clocks, explored how clocks work, and learned that some clocks don't even have numbers! (roman numerals)

Fun K-2 story of the week: On Wednesday, many of the students were disappointed that we had to go home early because of the weather. They wanted to stay and keep learning!

## 3-5 Classroom Updates

We started this week with fresh snow for our sled day. The class likes blazing the new sled runs for everyone. The end of the week has been too cold for sledding, but it's been a great winter so far.

In Word of God we continue to study the conquest of the land of Canaan. It's comforting to hear about our powerful God who protects his children.

Winter is a good time to focus on our math skills too. We are learning about fractions. Is the winter half over? Did a third of the class forget their sleds? Fractions are necessary for understanding quantities.

## 6-8 Classroom Updates

The 6-8th grade students are beginning their written report projects. They have all chosen a topic to study. They are in the process of finding library books and websites to research and learn about their topic. Next, we will learn how to take notes and turn those notes into effective paragraphs that show what we learned!

In 7-8th grade Social Studies, we have been learning about the Cold War. We have seen how the rivalry between the Soviet Union and the United States often led to conflicts such as the Korean War. This unit of our Social Studies book reminds us how thankful we are that God is in control of all world events that take place. There were some scary moments during the cold war where conflict with nuclear weapons or all out warfare could have broken out. We are thankful that God promises that he will take care of us, watch over us, and use all things that happen for the good fo those who love him (us!).
