



## K-2 Classroom Updates

The K-2 class is very excited to be in the midst of the Pennies for Patients fundraiser. We love being able to eat ice cream on Wednesdays and have a lot of fun dressing up on Fridays. Indoor recess is definitely a favorite too. It is also an opportunity to take time out and talk about what it means to have cancer, how we can support and encourage those who have cancer, and in general, how we can be kind and helpful out of thankfulness for what Jesus did for us.

In reading, the second graders are in the midst of reading, Ready, Freddy: Ready, Set, Snow. They are doing lots of thinking about characters and how they respond to challenges. The first graders are learning strategies to help them as they come across tricky words as they read and the kindergartners are reading lots and lots of patterns books to help them read more snap words and sound out more and more words.
