Ash Wednesday

The service begins without pre-service music, in silence. Please respect the silence of your fellow worshippers. Read the following section from Scripture below and meditate upon it to prepare your heart.

PSALM 51

For the director of music. A psalm of David. When the prophet Nathan came to him after David had committed adultery with Bathsheba.

¹ Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.
² Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.
⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge. ⁵ Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. ⁶ Yet you desired faithfulness even in the womb; you taught me wisdom in that secret place.

⁷ Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow. ⁸ Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice. ⁹ Hide your face from my sins and blot out all my iniquity.

¹⁰ Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. ¹¹ Do not cast me from your presence or take your Holy Spirit from me. ¹² Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me.

¹³ Then I will teach transgressors your ways, so that sinners will turn back to you. ¹⁴ Deliver me from the guilt of bloodshed, O God, you who are God my Savior, and my tongue will sing of your righteousness. ¹⁵ Open my lips, Lord, and my mouth will declare your praise. ¹⁶ You do not delight in sacrifice, or I would bring it; you do not take pleasure in burnt offerings. ¹⁷ My sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart you, God, will not despise.

¹⁸ May it please you to prosper Zion, to build up the walls of Jerusalem. ¹⁹ Then you will delight in the sacrifices of the righteous, in burnt offerings offered whole; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

INSTRUCTION FOR THE BEGINNING OF LENT

P: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God created us to know joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment but to turn to him and live: "Throw off all the transgressions you have committed, and get yourselves a new heart and a new spirit. Why should you die, house of Israel? For I take no pleasure in anyone's death. This is the declaration of the Lord God. So repent and live!" EZEKIEL 18:31-32

Therefore God in his mercy has sent his Son, the Christ, to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to die the death we deserve: "He made the one who did not know sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." 2 CORINTHIANS 5:21

During the forty days of Lent, we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God. The time of Lent reminds us that to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death: "My goal is to know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death, in hope that I will somehow reach the resurrection from among the dead." PHILIPPIANS 3:10-11

As disciples of Christ Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor. I invite you, therefore, to confess your sins, ask our Father for forgiveness, and *commit yourself to this struggle*. Let us be still. Let us be quiet. "The Lord is in his holy temple; let the whole earth be silent in his presence." HABAKKUK 2:20

Time for reflection and self-examination.

CONFESSION OF SIN

- P: Almighty God:
- C: Out of the depths I cry to you, Lord; Lord, hear my voice. Let your ears be attentive to my cry for mercy.
- P: If you, Lord, would count our iniquities, O Lord, who could stand?
- C: But with you there is pardon, so you are feared.
- P: I wait for the Lord. My soul waits, and in his word I have put my hope. My soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning.
- C: More than watchmen wait for the morning.

Silence for self-reflection.

- P: Have mercy on us, Lord. We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved the Holy Spirit.
- C: Forgive me.
- P: We confess to you, O Lord, all our past unfaithfulness—the pride, the hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives.
- C: Forgive me.
- P: We confess to you, O Lord, our self-indulgent appetites and ways, our manipulation of other people, our anger when

our selfish aims are denied, and our coveting of those more fortunate than ourselves.

C: Forgive me.

P: We confess to you, O Lord, our love of worldly stuff and comforts and evils. We confess our dishonesty in daily life and work.

C: Forgive me.

P: We confess our negligence in worship and prayer and our failure to show the faith that is in us. Forgive us, O Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering and our indifference to injustices and cruelty:

C: Lord, have mercy.

- P: For all false judgments, for unloving thoughts toward others, and for our prejudice and contempt for those who differ from us:
- C: Christ, have mercy.
- P: For all we think or say or do that is at variance with your will:
- C: Hear us, O Lord, for your mercy is great!

HYMN

- 4 O Savior, when we loved you not, You loved and saved us all; O great good Shepherd of mankind, Oh, hear us when we call.

P: Wait confidently for the Lord, because with the Lord there is mercy. With him there is abundant redemption. He himself will redeem Israel from all its guilt. PSALM 130:7-8

By the authority of Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

During these days of Lent, let us implore God to give us renewal and his Holy Spirit. May we continue to abide in the true faith and at last be received by him through the merits of Jesus Christ our Lord.

- 1 Chief of sinners though I be, Jesus shed his blood for me, Died that I might live on high, Lives that I might never die. As the branch is to the vine, I am his and he is mine!
- Oh, the height of Jesus' love, Higher than the heav'ns above, Deeper than the depths of sea, Lasting as eternity, Love that found me—wondrous thought!— Found me when I sought him not.

First Lesson

2 Samuel 12:1-13

David confesses: I have sinned against the Lord.

The LORD sent Nathan to David. When he came to him, he said, "There were two men in a certain town, one rich and the other poor. ² The rich man had a very large number of sheep and cattle, ³ but the poor man had nothing except one little ewe lamb he had bought. He raised it, and it grew up with him and his children. It shared his food, drank from his cup and even slept in his arms. It was like a daughter to him.

⁴ "Now a traveler came to the rich man, but the rich man refrained from taking one of his own sheep or cattle to prepare a

meal for the traveler who had come to him. Instead, he took the ewe lamb that belonged to the poor man and prepared it for the one who had come to him." ⁵ David burned with anger against the man and said to Nathan, "As surely as the LORD lives, the man who did this must die! ⁶ He must pay for that lamb four times over, because he did such a thing and had no pity."

⁷Then Nathan said to David, "You are the man! This is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'I anointed you king over Israel, and I delivered you from the hand of Saul. ⁸ I gave your master's house to you, and your master's wives into your arms. I gave you all Israel and Judah. And if all this had been too little, I would have given you even more. ⁹ Why did you despise the word of the LORD by doing what is evil in his eyes? You struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife to be your own. You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites. ¹⁰ Now, therefore, the sword will never depart from your house, because you despised me and took the wife of Uriah the Hittite to be your own.'


¹¹ "This is what the LORD says: 'Out of your own household I am going to bring calamity on you. Before your very eyes I will take your wives and give them to one who is close to you, and he will sleep with your wives in broad daylight. ¹² You did it in secret, but I will do this thing in broad daylight before all Israel.'"

¹³ Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the LORD." Nathan replied, "The LORD has taken away your sin. You are not going to die."

PSALM OF THE DAY

Psalm 51a

The prayer of David after Nathan confronted him.





Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me <u>from</u> my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always be<u>fore</u> me.

Against you, you only, <u>have</u> I sinned and done what is evil <u>in</u> your sight.

Surely I was sin<u>ful</u> at birth,

sinful from the time my mother con<u>ceived</u> me.

SECOND LESSON Acts 5:1-11

Ananias and Sapphira try to hide their sin.

Now a man named Ananias, together with his wife Sapphira, also sold a piece of property. ² With his wife's full knowledge he kept back part of the money for himself, but brought the rest and put it at the apostles' feet. ³ Then Peter said, "Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the

Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of the money you received for the land? ⁴ Didn't it belong to you before it was sold? And after it was sold, wasn't the money at your disposal? What made you think of doing such a thing? You have not lied just to human beings but to God."

⁵ When Ananias heard this, he fell down and died. And great fear seized all who heard what had happened. ⁶ Then some young men came forward, wrapped up his body, and carried him out and buried him.

⁷ About three hours later his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. ⁸ Peter asked her, "Tell me, is this the price you and Ananias got for the land?"

"Yes," she said, "that is the price."

⁹ Peter said to her, "How could you conspire to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out also." ¹⁰ At that moment she fell down at his feet and died. Then the young men came in and, finding her dead, carried her out and buried her beside her husband. ¹¹ Great fear seized the whole church and all who heard about these events.

VERSE OF THE DAY

Read together.

Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity.

GOSPEL

Matthew 27:27-31

The soldiers mock the Christ.

²⁷ Then the governor's soldiers took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole company of soldiers around him. ²⁸ They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, ²⁹ and then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head. They put a staff in his right hand. Then they knelt in front of him and mocked him. "Hail, king of the Jews!" they said. ³⁰ They spit on him, and took the staff and struck him on the head again and

again. ³¹ After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

Saint Peter Lutheran Church practices close communion. We do this not to make a judgment about you or to deny that you are a Christian. We are following God's Word that says: "Whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord," (1 CORINTHIANS 11:27) and "Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf" (1 CORINTHIANS 10:17). C: Amen.


WORDS OF INSTITUTION

The Rite of Ashes

THE RITE OF ASHES

During the singing of the anthem, the worshippers can follow the directions of the ushers to the front of the sanctuary from the outside aisles. At the front of the church the head of the family will draw a cross with ashes on a sackcloth banner to symbolize their recognition that their sins and human frailties are placed on Christ. An usher will provide a glove for each family for the sake of limiting exposure and easy clean-up.


While you take your ashes, the pastor will say, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Jesus Christ is your life." When you are done, please exit the sanctuary and remain quiet until all worshippers have finished. When the anthem ends, we will finish in silence. There will be no post-service music.

The banner will hang in our sanctuary until Good Friday to remind us of our need for and commitment to repentance.
