Minor Prophets – Major Messages: An Introduction to and Application of the Old Testament Minor Prophets They are simply referred to as "the Twelve" by Hebrew scholars. The twelve small books that sit at the end of our Old Testament are largely unfamiliar to most Christians. So why study them? Not only are the as divinely-inspired as major books like Genesis and Isaiah, they have bold law and gospel content in condensed form. They also answer fundamental questions like: "What is God's love really like?" "When is God satisfied with an offering?" and "Is there any earthly benefit to faith?"
